

Diocesan Insurance Program

The insurance coverage for all entities in the Fargo diocese is provided through Catholic Mutual. The insurance program carries a \$1,000 deductible to the parish/institution for property losses. The deductible to the Diocesan Insurance Fund or pool is \$25,000. The difference (\$1,000-\$25,000) is self-insured. Catholic Mutual acts as the third party administrator of the self-insurance fund.

Catholic Umbrella Pool II (CUP II)

The Diocese of Fargo is a member of Catholic Umbrella Pool II (CUP II) for the excess liability coverage carried by all entities covered by the Diocesan Insurance Program.

Members of CUP II participate in risk prevention and awareness by having covered entities complete a Self-Inspection Report each year. In addition, the Loss Control Representative visits the Diocese each year and physically inspects selected locations.

Members of CUP II are required to adopt and follow policies established and approved by CUP II for the common good of the membership. Since the inception of CUP II in 1989, only three policies have been adopted by CUP II that are binding on the membership, and therefore also on the Diocese of Fargo. They are:

1. Contract Review Policy (Effective July 1, 1993)
2. Vehicle Safety Policy (Effective July 1, 1995)
3. 10-15 Passenger Van Use Policy (Effective July 1, 2003)
