

WHAT TO BRING:

Bible, pen, notebook, sleeping bag (or bedding), pillow, personal hygiene items, towel & washcloth. Clothing for warm weather and cool weather, **(modesty is expected always)**, bathrobe and flip flops for showers, alarm clock and a watch. Girls bring a modest swim suit, you will be asked to wear a colored t-shirt over it. Boys you will be asked to wear a colored t-shirt when swimming! Mosquito repellent and suntan lotion are optional, but could be necessary in July. A camera is nice, please have it marked with your name on it. **A water bottle is a must for everyone, please have your name on it!** Please bring a snack to share with the other campers. Something that feeds at least 10 is great! Suggestions: Fruit, veggies and dip, crackers, bars or cookies, salty items or candy (preferably wrapped individually). We will provide lots of water for drinking.

WHAT NOT TO BRING:

Please do not bring any electronic entertainment devices such as ipods, personal cd players, game boys, etc. We do not allow fireworks, coolers, alcohol, drugs, cigarettes or chewing tobacco.

FIRST DAY OF CAMP:

Friday, the last day of your child's camp week, you are invited to Mass at 5pm, potluck supper at 6:15pm, talent show at 7:00pm and official closing of camp at 8:00pm. Let us know what you will bring for the potluck. More information about camp will come to your home before your child's week of camp.
